THE NEW PICTURE PUZZLE GAME

WITH PLAYING FRAME

FOR ONE, TWO, THREE OR FOUR PLAYERS

CONSISTS of four sets of pieces, 70 to each set, each set with different colored backs—

Also an 8-piece playing frame forming four triangular spaces in which pieces are matched.



PREPARING TO PLAY

Someone will first put the 8-piece playing frame together, the four outside pieces, and four cross pieces, locking together at corners, per diagram. *Be sure to match color to color at corners, viz: Red to Red, Blue to Blue, Green to Green, Tan to Tan.*

PLAYING DIRECTIONS

EACH player selects a box of pieces. (Blue is North; green South; yellow East; red West), and matches his pieces in space of same color as shown by title of picture (Blue, Green, Yellow or Red) on the outside frame.

There are various ways to play:

1. The player who puts his section together first wins the game; or
2. The player who puts together the largest number of pieces, within a given time, wins the game; or
3. One player having put his section together, his total number of pieces (70) counts as so many points, the other players having as many points as number of pieces they have successfully matched.

The game consists of one playoff as above, or a series of playoffs, players changing places or turning frame around, after each playoff, so that each plays a different section with different shaped pieces each time.

After each playoff the pieces of each picture will be scrambled before playing again. Players can play against each other or two can play as "sides" against two others.

Several games of Budge, played simultaneously or progressively, like Bridge, with or without prizes, is ideal for parties.
